PERFORMANCE AGREEMENT

In 2003, legislation was passed requiring a Type A Economic Development Corporation (the CTEDC) to enter into a written performance agreement with a business enterprise when the corporation provides funding or makes expenditures on behalf of the business enterprise in furtherance of a permissible Type A project.

This performance agreement between the corporation and the business enterprise at a minimum must contain the following:

- (1) a schedule of additional payroll or jobs to be created or retained;
- (2) the capital investment to be made by the business enterprise; and
- (3) the terms under which repayment must be made by the business enterprise to the Type A corporation should the business fail to meet the performance requirements specified in the agreement.

In 2007, the Texas Legislature passed House Bill 1196, which requires that both governmental entities and economic development corporations include certain language in any written agreement involving public subsidies to businesses, which would include those given by Type A corporations.

The language must specify that the business does not and will not knowingly employ an undocumented worker (which statement must also be any application for the subsidy). The language also must require repayment of the subsidy with specified rate and terms of interest if the business is convicted of federal immigration violations as defined in Chapter 2264 of Subtitle F, Title 10 of the Government Code (80(R) HB 1196), not later than the 120th day after receiving notice of the violation from the public entity or economic development corporation.
